

A/UX 3.0 and stropen: out of streams Message

TOPIC -----

I have a customer running A/UX 3.0 who is frequently getting "stropen out of streams" messages on his console window. He has not been able to correlate these messages appearing to any particular activity or application program. He has already doubled the NSTREAM and NQUEUE parameters from their defaults, and is still getting these messages.

He's also getting a "fcntl: Local lock-manager not registered" message after booting showing up in the console window.

His hardware configuration is: Quadra 950 with an external Maxtor drive and an external La Cie DAT drive. The monitor is Apple 21" using built-in video. No additional cards. There's a StyleWriter on the printer port, and a Telebit QBlazer on the modem port.

Here is what kconfig -a says: NBUF = 0

DISCUSSION -----

The "stropen: out of streams" is a fatal error message. It indicates that there is not enough memory to set up and run streams in A/UX.

We suggest that the customer either add more physical RAM to the system, or (not recommend) reduce some kernel memory parameters like NBUF, NFILE, NINODE, NSTREAM, NQUEUE, ... etc. with 'kconfig'.

The "fcntl: Local ..." message is the result from the first message.

On a Quadra 950, 8MB of physical RAM is the minimum for a single user as long as you are not networking. 16MB to 20MB of physical RAM will allow greater functionality and generally provide the memory you need. Copyright 1993, Apple Computer, Inc.
