QuickTime for Windows: Library not found Message (3/93)

TOPIC -----

I just installed QuickTime for Windows on a DOS 5.0/Windows 3.1 machine. Installation ran fine with no errors reported.

In trying to start the applications MoviePlayer and PictureViewer, I got the error message: "QuickTime for Windows could not run because the QuickTime library could not be found."

My assumption is that Windows can't find one or more of the .DLLs that comes with QuickTime. Where should the .DDLs be stored? What in the Windows environment needs to be updated ?

QUESTION -----

It is very likely that the QuickTime applications cannot locate the required .DLL files.

The installation program normally ensures that the SET LIB, SET INCLUDE, and PATH statements are properly updated to include the directories containing the QuickTime for Windows tools, libraries, and header files. That is, unless you do not allow the SETUP program to modify your AUTOEXEC.BAT file.

In this case, you would need to modify the AUTOEXEC.BAT file yourself. The suggested changes should be in a file called AUTOEXEC.QTW. SETUP produced the file during the installation process. The basic alteration required to get the MoviePlayer and PictureViewer applications working is to ensure a PATH entry pointing to the QTW\BIN directory exists.
