This article describes how to create documents in Japanese (Kanji), E-mail them to Macintosh systems in the U.S., and still display them in Kanji.

DISCUSSION -----

One method is to use file transfer via one of the international network services, like CompuServe. Create the document in Japan, transfer the document file, and open the document in the U.S. To do this, the Macintosh systems, both in Japan and in the U.S., must have KanjiTalk software (the Japanese Macintosh operating system) to display the Kanji characters. You can get KanjiTalk in the U.S. through a Kanji authorized reseller. Call 1-800-882-8856 to find your nearest reseller.

AppleLink-J is another alternative. The person receiving the document must have KanjiTalk and an application that supports double-byte characters. Copyright 1989, 1992, Apple Computer, Inc.
