| What are the services that a PowerShare server can provide out of the box?   |
| DISCUSSION   |
| The PowerShare Servers provide three primary services that enable a wide range of collaborative applications:  |
| 1) Catalog services. A shared, centrally-administered catalog which can be used by users and collaborative applications.   |
| 2) Authentication services. The Catalog Server acts as a trusted third party in establishing authenticated network connections.  |
| 3) Mail services. A store-and-forward mail and message server. Catalog services In a PowerShare System, the catalog is a collection of records stored in folders on one or more PowerShare Catalog Servers. Each catalog record contains information about an entity in the PowerShare System, which can be a user, group of users, network device (such as a printer or file server), purchase order forms, or meeting rooms.
