## System 7: DataDesk Keyboard Compatibility (11/94)

TOPIC
This article gives compatibility information for DataDesk keyboards used with System 7.
DISCUSSION

Some older DataDesk Macintosh 101 keyboards do not allow you to disable extensions under System 7 by holding down the Shift key during startup. There is no known workaround for this problem, short of temporarily replacing the DataDesk keyboard with an Apple keyboard.

Specific compatibility issues:

- Macintosh 101 Keyboard (Macintosh Plus) Version 1.0 Incompatible INIT Currently won't recognize any keys pressed during startup. Requires an upgrade to use extended part of the keyboard.
- Macintosh 101 keyboard (ADB) Version 1.0
  No INIT is needed Won't recognize any keys pressed during startup.
  This keyboard is likely to be at least three years old.
- Macintosh 101 Keyboard (ADB or Macintosh Plus) Version 1.1 Compatible with System 7.
- Macintosh 101e Keyboard (ADB or Macintosh Plus) Compatible with System 7.
- Macintosh Switchboard (ADB or Macintosh Plus) Compatible with System 7.
