At Ease 4.0: At Ease Server Dialog Box Issue (8/96)

TOPIC -----

I am setting up my At Ease 4.0 and AppleShare server using the At Ease Administration application at the At Ease Server dialog box. When I enter the Volume Name and login as a registered user I get this message, "The At Ease server user access information is no longer valid." What causes this to happen?

DISCUSSION -----

You need to know the name of the hard disk volume on the AppleShare server where your At Ease information will be stored.

You need to have a valid AppleShare user name and password. The AppleShare user that you specify must have access to write to the root of the server volume.

If you are not sure about what AppleShare volume, user name, or password you should use, contact your AppleShare administrator.

NOTE: For security reasons, you should not use an AppleShare guest user name to log in to the At Ease server. As an added security measure, you may want to have your AppleShare administrator create a special user whose access on the AppleShare server is limited to only those locations where the At Ease information is stored.
