## Japanese Font in Finder: Created Folders Use Kotoeri (5/93)

TOPIC -----

Whenever the Finder font is set to a Japanese font, the system always jumps into Kotoeri when changing a file or folder name in the Finder. Is there a way to turn this feature off?

DISCUSSION -----

In the manual, Apple recommends setting the Views to a Japanese font so that folders will have names properly displayed (not names with garbage characters). Thereafter, when you create folders it makes sense for the Finder to "jump into Kotoeri" since you have a Japanese font selected.

You could select a Roman font from Views, but then you have the "garbage" characters' problem. A more elegant solution is to click on the Roman font option from the Operations Pallet (upper right corner option -- the "A with a down arrow"). To select this option you could also use two short cuts:

- Press "shift option tab" to rotate through the Operations Pallet options, or
- Press "option shift-d"
