| In HyperTalk scripts, a string of two hyphens () indicate a comment. HyperTalk ignores all characters that follow the double-hyphen. |
| DISCUSSION |
| In the following example, the strings "Displays a dialog box" and "the user's reply" are ignored by HyperTalk. |
| on mouseUp Displays a dialog box answer "What?" with "No" or "Yes" put it the user's reply end mouseUp |
| Shortcuts • To comment several lines at once, drag to select the lines you want to comment, then choose Comment from the Script menu (or press Command-hyphen). |
| • To uncomment several lines at once, drag to select the lines you want to uncomment and then choose Uncomment from the Script menu (or press Command-=). |
