## HyperCard: Finding Text in Scripts (7/92)

TOPIC -----

This article describes how find a string of text in a script.

DISCUSSION -----

To find a string of text in a script (no matter where it's located), type the following into the message box:

```
ss "search string "
```

For example, in order to find a handler called MoveItAround, type

```
ss "MoveItAround"
```

into the message box. HyperCard will search all scripts in the open stack. When it finds the script containing the string, it will stop and open the script up. To find exactly where the string is within the script, choose "Find" under the "Go" menu or type command-F. HyperCard will have automatically copied and pasted the string into the Find window. At this point, hitting the Enter key will find it and show you exactly where it is in the script.
