QuickTime provides Macintosh developers and customers with a software-only solution for integrating motion video into Macintosh applications.
What Do I Need to Run HyperCard with QuickTime?
• A Macintosh computer with a 68020 processor or better.
• The QuickTime stack is a high-level authoring tool for users to integrate movies into their HyperCard applications. You must have Apple QuickTime software before the HyperCard QuickTime tool will function.
• System 7.0 or better, and Apple QuickTime extension 1.0 or later.
• HyperCard 2.1 or later (HyperCard memory allocation must be 2MB or more.)
