TOPIC -----

In September 1992, Apple began bundling HyperCard 2.1 Player with Macintosh systems sold in the United States. HyperCard 2.1 Player was either on a floppy disk or installed on the hard disk.

In December 1993, Apple took ownership of HyperCard and began sales of HyperCard 2.2. HyperCard 2.2 has the ability to create standalone applications.

DISCUSSION -----

HyperCard 2.1 Player is a run-time version of HyperCard. It consists of:

- the HyperCard run-time engine
- a Home stack
- a Read Me file

(No sample stacks are included.)

HyperCard 2.2, running on a Macintosh with System 7, can be used to create a standalone application from any HyperCard stack. Standalone applications work on their own: others can use your stacks even if they don't own HyperCard.

HyperCard is available from Apple Software Resellers, Apple Resellers and from APDA.
