

Kermit File Transfer Protocol

Columbia University created the Kermit protocol for mainframe-tomicrocomputer file transfers. Red Ryder 9.4, a "shareware" communications package, supports the Kermit protocol and is available on most public bulletin board systems. Another software package, Mac240 from White Pine Software, supports VT240, VT220, VT100, and the Kermit protocol.
