MODE32: How to Access More Than 8 Megabytes (2/94)

TOPIC -----

I have a Macintosh which has 24-bit ROMs and I wanted to access more than 8 megabytes of memory with System 7, so I installed MODE32. When I open About This Macintosh in the Apple Menu, my system size is larger than 8 megabytes, yet I cannot access more than 8 megabytes of memory.

How can I access more than 8 megabytes?

DISCUSSION -----

Your Macintosh is still set to 24-bit memory addressing and cannot access more than 8 megabytes. You must set your Macintosh to 32-bit addressing. To do so, follow these steps:

- 1) Select Control Panels from the Apple Menu, then select the Memory Control Panel.
- 2) Click on 32-bit addressing in the Memory Control Panel.
- 3) Restart your Macintosh.

Your Macintosh will now be able to access more than 8 megabytes of memory.
