

AppleShare 2 and 3: Access Privileges for Apple II Network

TOPIC
This article tells you how to set access privileges on an Apple II network under AppleShare 2 or 3 and System 7.
DISCUSSION
Follow these steps:
1) Be sure to share the entire startup volume. Owner, Group, and Everyone can "See Files, See Folders." Change all enclosed folders unless you have an existing server. With an existing server, don't apply changes to enclosed folders you want Apple IIGS users denied access to some of the folders.
2) Give access to the folder named System, and all folders within it. Owner, Group, and Everyone can "See Files, See Folders." Change all enclosed folders.
3) If using Aristotle, follow these steps:
a) For the Users Folder: Owner, Group, and Everyone can "See Files, See Folders." Owner and Group can "Make Changes." Group is Teacher. DON'T change all enclosed folders.
b) For the Aristotle Folder: Owner, Group, and Everyone can "See Files, See Folders." Owner and Group can "Make Changes." Group is Teacher. Change all enclosed folders.
