TrueType Fonts: Installing on Macintosh Plus with No Hard Disk

TOPIC -----

I have a 1MB Macintosh Plus with no hard disk, and I just purchased a StyleWriter printer. I want to print with TrueType fonts, but without a hard disk I have little room on an 800K disk. Is there a solution?

DISCUSSION -----

Here are the steps to get TWO TrueType fonts on the disk and have about 46K left.

Follow these steps to install the minimal system software:

- 1) Format an 800K disk.
- 2) Run the install from the System 6.0.7 disk.
- 3) Be sure to click on Switch Disk and Eject Disk buttons as needed.
- 4) Insert the new formatted disk and do a minimum install for Macintosh Plus (this leaves about 435K available).

Follow these steps to install the StyleWriter software:

- 1) Insert the StyleWriter Installation disk.
- 2) Custom install for the TrueType (INIT) - 101K and the StyleWriter driver (163K).

You should now have about 150-170K available.

Follow these steps to install the individual TrueType fonts (remember that the fonts each take up 60-70K):

- 1) Insert the TrueType fonts disk from the StyleWriter package.
- 2) Open the Font/DA Mover.
- 3) The right window should show information (fonts) in the System file.
- 4) Click on Open in the right window.
- 5) Shift-click to select the desired fonts. (Please note at this point you probably can only select two fonts because of minimal space left on the disk.)
- 6) Click on Copy.
- 7) Restart the computer from your new startup disk.
