System 7.5: PowerTalk Features for PowerBook Computers (2/95)

TOPIC -----

This article provides an overview of the PowerTalk capabilities within System 7.5 available for PowerBook computers.

DISCUSSION -----

Because PowerTalk software enables collaboration, it is especially useful for those of you who need to communicate with others, whether or not you are connecting to a local area network, a public e-mail service, or directly to another Macintosh computer. Even if you are not part of a network, you can install PowerTalk Personal Gateway Software (available from third parties) to get easy access to fax, pager, and e-mail services, as well as the Internet.

PowerTalk puts everything you need to communicate in one place. You can organize information needed to collaborate -- such as electronic addresses, phone and fax numbers, and supporting notes -- in easy-to-access catalogs that you can take with you wherever you go. Your DigiSign "signer" can also travel with you, enabling you to approve and verify documents -- even when you are on the road.

PowerTalk was specifically designed for those of you who frequently connect to a network, work off-line, and then reconnect at a later time. With PowerTalk, you can quickly and easily copy mail from a server, read it off-line, and compose replies. When you reconnect to the network, all messages are sent automatically.
