

Macintosh: Resource Map is Bad Message

TOPIC -----

While starting up my Macintosh SE, I saw the message "Resource Map is Bad." What does this mean? (Startup continued without further problems.)

DISCUSSION -----

The resource map is a template that interprets the resource forks in any file into something intelligent. The Macintosh OS generates ID bombs (between -192 and -199) if it finds a serious problem in the resource fork.

We suspect that the message was generated by another application or utility. If it happened only once, don't be alarmed. However, we suggest running a file verification utility against the hard drive and possibly backing it up (just in case). Copyright 1991 Apple Computer, Inc.
