

PhotoFlash: Description (10/93)

TOPIC -----

This article describes the PhotoFlash software.

DISCUSSION -----

PhotoFlash is a photo-publishing product that focuses on the process of working with photos in documents. It provides tools for:

- Image management (a browser)
- Acquisition (support for many file formats and acquire plug-ins)
- Adjustment (basic image prep and tone control), and
- Placement into documents (automatic scripts).

As it is a companion to document creation, PhotoFlash is also very compact and fast, occupying around 3MB of RAM and providing responsive editing and adjustment tools. This allows a modest computer (8 to 12MB RAM) to run page layout software and PhotoFlash at the same time to speed the process of photo-publishing.

PhotoFlash is delivered on 2 floppy disks, along with a disk full of sample images. The PhotoFlash package also includes AppleScript 1.0 and QuickTime 1.6.1, which are part of the one-button installation process. PhotoFlash is fully scriptable and recordable and can be linked with many AppleScript applications for enhanced productivity.
