

## AppleShare PC: Troubleshooting a NET 810 Error Message

TOPIC -----

I recently got this message on my computer while running AppleShare PC: "NET 810: Unexpected Network Error". Then my computer disconnected from the network. What could be causing this?

DISCUSSION -----

This error could be caused by a number of factors. NET 810 is the network number that is randomly assigned to any particular network. The unexpected network error means that somewhere in the network there may be a break or open connection.

Locating the problem may be difficult, if it happens randomly. Also, if the problem occurs only with this one computer, it could be related specifically to the LocalTalk PC Card (or other network card) installed in the machine.

Here is a diagnostic procedure to follow:

- 1) Check that all user connections are tight and that the network is terminated properly.
- 2) Break it down into smaller groups and verify that those users can see the server with no problem. Continue until the problem crops up.
- 3) Check the hardware in that small group or one machine that is failing. You could be looking at a possible cable, LocalTalk PC card, or logic board failure somewhere in the network.
