

## **Apple TechStep: Memory Capabilities (5/93)**

TOPIC -----

I would like some information on whether or not the Apple TechStep has the ability to buffer/store system information, other than diagnostic routines. We have several "classified" accounts that will not allow units that contain any type of non volatile memory into those areas.

Please advise.

DISCUSSION -----

The Apple TechStep has six levels of memory which are listed below:

- Processor ROM: Can only be written to once (at the factory) and then never changes.
- Processor EEPROM: Can be (but is not currently) written to at any time and remains even if all power is removed.
- Processor RAM: Cleared when power is turned off.
- Logic board RAM: Cleared when power is turned off
- ROM pack ROM: Can only be written to once (at the factory) and then never changes.
- ROM pack EEPROM: Can be written to at any time and remains even if all power is removed (used for "logs").

One solution for this account might be to buy extra ROM packs and leave them at these classified sites. Copyright 1993, Apple Computer, Inc.
