

Apple Workgroup Server 95 and A/UX 3.0.1 Utilities (7/93)

TOPIC -----

I have a question on the Apple Workgroup Server (AWS) 95 about A/UX related utilities. I'm specifically interested in the TCP/IP suite which should include rlogin, telnet, ftp. I'm also interested in the lpr printing environment, the C development environment, and Xwindows environment.

The manuals I got with the AWS 95 tell me that I can install these options as needed, but I can't find them in the custom install program options. The manual is not very specific about how to install these packages.

What I need to know is, what comes with the AWS 95 software in addition to basic A/UX that runs the computer? How are the utilities installed, and where do they reside on the CD-ROM?

DISCUSSION -----

In addition to the core A/UX 3.0.1 system software, the system software installer CD-ROM contains 21 additional services, and UNIX programs you can add to the system as needed.

You should refer to the Custom Install Option, starting at page 139 of the Setting Up and Managing Your Server manual, appendix B. Page 158 describes the procedure to install A/UX 3.0.1 software packages. The window "Choose Software" on page 159 shows two columns: Software and Additional Space Required. Examples of names under software are:

Core A/UX System More UNIX Utilities UNIX Printing Utilities Networking Capabilities and so on

Appendix A: A/UX 3.0.1 Software Packages, describes what is in each package starting at page 120 in the same manual. For example, for NFS, NIS, FTP, talk, rlogin, and other UNIX networking capabilities, the user should

select Networking Capabilities. For UNIX printing utilities, including TranScript, lpr, and lp, select UNIX Printing Utilities. For X Windows, there are a few packages to choose from: MacX, X Client Sampler, X11 Server & More, and X Programming.

Starting at page 128, the manual also describes how to copy individual files from the CD-ROM and how to mount the system software installer CD-ROM. Copyright 1993, Apple Computer, Inc.
