DEC LanWORKS: Missing VMS Encrypted Password UAM

TOPIC -----

The documentation I have seen for DEC LanWORKS states that there are three User Access Methods available: Apple Standard UAMs, Encrypted VMS Password, and Clear Text VMS Password.

In the 1.0 release of LanWORKS, I cannot find a way to enable the Encrypted VMS Password UAM. I understood that there should be a UAM file placed in the Macintosh's System Folder:AppleShare Folder. The file for Encrypted VMS Password UAM seems to be lacking. Is this the case?

Second, it appears that the VMS UAMs can be enabled/disabled by moving the file(s) to or from the System Folder:AppleShare Folder. If I want to disallow clear text passwords, is there any way to disable the Apple Standard UAM? If not, is DEC is planning to support the standard AppleShare encrypted password method?

DISCUSSION -----

You probably have the pre-release documentation of DEC LanWORKS. The Encrypted VMS Password UAM has been removed from the release version of the product, now named PATHWORKS.

It is correct that there is not a file for Apple Standard UAM to remove, and so there is no way to disable the Apple Standard UAM. We don't know what the plan is for supporting Apple Encrypted Password method, but we will forward your request to the Apple/Digital team for evaluation.
