

Macintosh IIfx Logic Bd Upgrade: Terminator is Included (11/94)

TOPIC -----

I've upgraded my Macintosh II to a Macintosh IIfx and am having trouble mounting my internal hard drive. I've been told I need to have a "Macintosh IIfx motherboard terminator and filter" module in line with the 50 pin SCSI data cable. Where do I find this?

DISCUSSION -----

The part you are looking for comes in the Macintosh IIfx Accessory Kit with the Macintosh IIfx Logic Board Upgrade. It's in a little plastic bag and is grey with a beige terminator attached.

You need to remove the beige terminator and place the grey filter between the drive cable and the drive. If you cannot find this part, it can be ordered through Apple Service, part number 590-4516.

Understand that the terminator is required ONLY if no internal SCSI hard drive is installed. If you have a drive installed, you have to remove the terminator to connect the drive cable. Consult the drive manufacturer to determine if the SCSI Filter is required for that particular drive.
