

Macintosh Portable: Third-Party Hard Drive May Void Warranty

TOPIC -----

I want to add a Microtech 100MB hard drive to the new backlit Macintosh Portable.

When I removed the 40MB internal drive, I noticed the SCSI connection was an internal 34-pin connector, and not the 50-pin that is on the 100MB drive.

Can I have a 3-inch long SCSI 34-pin to 50-pin ribbon adapter cable made to allow the installation of the 100MB drive into the Macintosh Portable?

DISCUSSION -----

Those hard drives are not designed for to be used with portables because of the power requirements and possible heat problems.
