Macintosh Plus: How To Use MacTest

TOPIC -----

I'm having a problem using MacTest 7.0 to test Macintosh Plus computers. All fail the drive check and the serial loop check with an error something like (a <-- --> a b <-- --> b).

I'm using known-good software and known-good Apple serial cables.

DISCUSSION -----

You need to attach the SCSI Loopback connector differently when testing a Macintosh Plus.

To properly run the complete logic board tests and the SCSI Loopback tests, attach the mouse cable to the SCSI Loopback plug and the SCSI Loopback connector to the mouse port.

The SCSI Loopback connector gets its power from the SCSI port of the Macintosh under test for all models EXCEPT the Macintosh Plus, which doesn't supply +5V TERMPWR to the SCSI port. With the Macintosh Plus, the connector gets its power from the mouse port.
