MacX 1.2: Positioning, Objectives, and Issues

TOPIC -----

This article describes the marketing positioning, objectives, and issues related to the release of MacX 1.2 with System 7.1 and A/UX 3.0.

DISCUSSION -----

Positioning

MacX 1.2 provides compatibility with System 7.1, Apple's newest release of the Macintosh operating system, with additional features including Backing Store and Save Under to help regulate the frequency of screen updates and to improve client application display accuracy and performance.

FOR A/UX CUSTOMERS: Customers using MacX with A/UX 3.0 can choose to upgrade to MacX 1.2 by purchasing the MacX 1.2 update product. The next version of A/UX due by January will incorporate MacX 1.2.

Objectives

- Revise MacX to version 1.2 and provide the full and update MacX products for Macintosh Operating System customers by early October 1992 since all systems shipped after that date will be incompatible with version 1.1.7
- Provide a solution for A/UX customers by either declaring MacX 1.2 not necessary for their use or providing MacX 1.2 to all A/UX customers.

Issues

Due to the incompatibility of MacX 1.1.7 with System 7.1 and the decision to release the new version 1.2 immediately, the recently-built inventory of MacX 1.1.7 has to be reworked and transitioned by early October into MacX 1.2

Since A/UX 3.0 includes MacX 1.1.7, we needed a solution for customers purchasing A/UX after October. Given limited resources and inventory management issues, here is the resolution:

- CURRENT A/UX CUSTOMERS: Customers can purchase the MacX 1.2 update product, which can be installed on A/UX 3.0 by simply dragging the MacX application from the floppy.
- CUSTOMERS WHO PURCHASE A/UX from October 1992 to January 1993. This is the transition period in which some A/UX customers may decide that they would like to receive the latest release of MacX. We do not expect any significant number of users to be in this category, since MacX is primarily positioned to be a System 7.1 release with only one major new feature: Backing Store. The final decision is to help such customers by providing them with the update floppy through the Customer Assistance Center or equivalent on an exception basis.
- CUSTOMERS WHO PURCHASE A/UX after January 1992. Good news! A/UX will be revised in January to include both A/UX 3.0's (C2-Security) and MacX 1.2.

Due to the expanding size of the MacX binary application, we will be switching over to a High-Density floppy for the application. Based on initial research we have conducted, there are very few instances where MacX customers lack a SuperDrive. The Customer Assistance Center or equivalent will be ready to ship these customers a compacted version of the application on an exception basis.
