This article discusses the repair strategy for the Macintosh PowerBook 145.
DISCUSSION
The PowerBook 145 has two new parts, the display bezel and the expansion board (or daughterboard).
The PowerBook 145 expansion board is basically a PowerBook 170 expansion board without the 68882 math co-processor.
If a PowerBook 145 is returned for service, and it is determined that the expansion board is at fault, the PowerBook 145 expansion board will be replaced with a PowerBook 170 expansion board that includes the 68882 math co-processor.
If the expansion board is replaced, the "About This Macintosh" item in the Apple menu will show "PowerBook 170". Also, applications that use a math co-processor will have the use of the 68882.
