## Power Macintosh 8100/100AV: No Video from AV Card (6/96)

We have already replaced the AV card, the logic board, and power supply, but the computer still cannot display video from the AV card. What else can we check? DISCUSSION -----You should also verify that the computer has a known-good logic board power cable. Use the steps below to check this cable: Step 1 Locate the logic board power cable, which is a bundle of 21 multi-colored wires connecting the power supply and logic board. Step 2 Verify that there are 21 wires and that each wire is connected to the correct pin sockets on the two end connectors; each wire should be connected to the corresponding pins on each connector. If any wire is missing or if any wire is not properly connected, proceed to Step 3. Step 3 Replace the logic board power cable (922-0838). Copyright 1996, Apple Computer, Inc.
