

## TechStep: Mismatched & Misconfigured In RAM Test Results

DISCUSSION ------"Mismatched" means that a given bank contains more than one size of SIMM. When this is detected, the RAM size test puts a question mark ("?") after the RAM size. "Misconfigured" means that RAM bank A holds less memory than bank B. Note \_ \_ \_ \_ The Macintosh Classic cannot be misconfigured because bank A is soldered to the logic board; therefore, it will not report a "Misconfigured" result.
