When I write a sentence with a period at the end or a comma in the middle, Newton interprets the punctuation mark as the letter "l" or as an accent mark or hyphen. How can I make it differentiate between these marks?
DISCUSSION
To help Newton understand your punctuation marks better, particularly commas and periods, make certain you have placed them close to the word they follows.
