AudioVision 14 Display: Set Up Tips For Speech Recog (5/94)

TOPIC -----

This article gives set up and troubleshooting tips for the AudioVision 14 Display in regards to speech recognition with the Centris, Quadra, and Power Macintosh AV series computers.

DISCUSSION -----

The AudioVision 14 Display is compatible with the Centris, Quadra, and Power Macintosh AV series computers, including speech recognition. During monitor set up, two steps are important for speech recognition.

- 1) When connecting the AudioVision adapter cable, connect the sound-in plug to the external sound input port on the back of the computer.
- 2) Make sure the AudioVision's built-in microphone is turned on.

Note: The built-in microphone at the top of the display is not as sensitive as the external microphone input on the side of the display.

Troubleshooting Tips

- If speech recognition is not working properly, check the sound input options in the Sound Control Panel. The computer may be looking for sound from the wrong input port.

If the display is connected to the 45-pin monitor port on the computer, follow these steps:

- 1) Open the Sound Control Panel
- 2) Choose the Sound In option from the menu in the control panel window.
- 3) Click on Options
- 4) Change the input source to AV Connector

If the display is connected to the 15-pin monitor port on the computer and the sound cables are attached to the microphone input and output ports using the AudioVision adapter cable, follow these steps:

- 1) Open the Sound Control Panel
 - 2) Choose the Sound In option from the menu in the control panel window
 - 3) Click on Options
 - 4) Change the input source to Microphone
- Make sure the microphone is on by pressing the microphone switch on the front of the display until the amber light above the switch is on.
 - The Sound In options are ways of choosing the port you want to record sound from. If the monitor is plugged into the microphone jack, you want sound coming from the microphone. If the monitor is plugged into the HD-45 connector (AV Connector), you want to choose that port. The pictures in the control panel can be misleading since they depict the type of microphone or device and not the port you are recording from. The microphone picture is for the mini-stereo sound input port, the AV microphone picture is for the AV Monitor Connector, and the CD is for a CD drive.
