

Macintosh: Using Monitors Control Panel To Add/Change Display

TOPIC
When I added a Macintosh Portrait Display to my PowerBook, I couldn't move the mouse pointer to the new display.
DISCUSSION
Open the Monitors control panel, click on the picture of the Portrait Display you see there, then close the control panel. This updates the 'scrn' resource in the System file, so when the PowerBook is starting up, it is aware of the external monitor and adds it to its "display space."
This is not specific to the Portrait Display: if you set up a PowerBook to work with a Portrait Display, then connect the PowerBook to a different display, you'll have to go through the same process again.
You can also see this on other Macintosh models if you switch between displays on a single video card installed in a Macintosh. Copyright 1993, Apple Computer, Inc.
