DISCUSSION -----

Key Layout

Key location on the Apple Keyboard II differs from the earlier Apple Keyboard:

- The caps lock and control key exchanged places.
- The tilde key is where the escape key was.
- The vertical line key was moved to a new location above the new return key.
- The escape key took the vertical line's old spot.
- The return key was made smaller.
- The space bar was enlarged.

The international ISO version has a new key with ± and § characters and the escape key replaced the right-hand side command key.

Both keyboards' numeric keypads have the + and - keys reversed. It is the same as the extended keyboard. In addition, this is the same arrangement as a 10-key adding machine.

With the exception of the arrow and escape keys, Apple Keyboard II has a layout which is identical to the comparable parts of the Apple Extended Keyboard II.

Tilt Legs

At the ends on the back, the keyboard has two legs the user can extend to provide a greater tilt.

Compliance

The Apple Keyboard II is fully ANSI and ISO compliant.
