## Macintosh Print Pack: Description (3/93)

TOPIC -----

This article describes the Macintosh Print Pack.

DISCUSSION -----

The Macintosh Print Pack allows MS-DOS and Windows-compatible printers to be connected to Macintosh computers with a set of hardware and software tools.

The Print Pack includes a special cable to connect a Macintosh to virtually any printer that has a standard Centronics parallel port. Also included are special software printer drivers, which are installed with a one-click installer.

You can select your printer through the Chooser. The printer drivers available are:

Epson FX (for use with compatible 9 pin dot-matrix printers and any MS-DOS or Windows-compatible laser printers that use this emulation)

Epson LQ (for use with compatible 24-pin dot-matrix printers and any MS-DOS or Windows-compatible laser printers that use this emulation)

Kodak Diconix

Canon BJ10EX (for connection to compatible ink jet printers)

The Macintosh Print Pack is compatible with:

- all Macintosh font formats: bitmap, TrueType, and Adobe's Type 1
- all Macintosh graphics formats: bitmap, PICT, and TIFF.

It supports all standard paper sizes, vertical or horizontal page formats, and reduction or enlargement.

The Macintosh Print Pack requires System 7.1 and for optimal performance. Apple recommends a minimum of 4MB of RAM.
